Humanitarian Crisis at the U.S.-Mexico Border: Migration, Criminalization, and Militarization

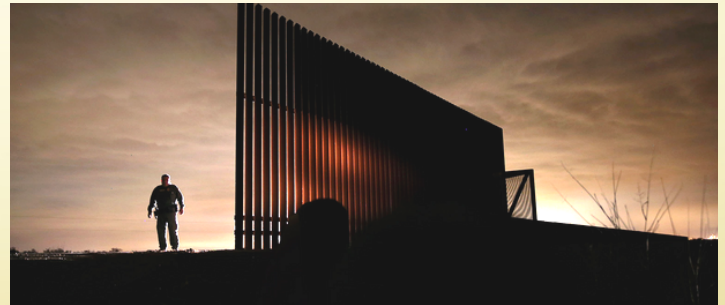
