

Drayton, Executive Director, Yawkey Club of Roxbury, Boys & Girls Clubs of Boston; and Marilyn Flowers-Marion, long-time Boston Public School teacher and chairperson, Retired Teachers Chapter of the Boston Teachers Union, as they share their heartfelt lived experiences and research on busing in Boston. They will explore what has and has not changed since Brown v. Board of Education and court-ordered desegregation and how hard-fought gains of desegregation have been reversed in school districts like Boston that are now as segregated as before the courts intervened. They will discuss what an equitable Boston Public School System should look like and explore the current state of racial equity in Boston and the long-term impacts of busing on the city and its reputation.
